



THE DIFFICULT WORDS OF JESUS Sunday Mornings October 16 - November 13 from 8:15-9:00am

Jesus provided his disciples teachings for how to follow Torah, God's word; he told them parables to help them discern questions of ethics and of human nature; he offered them beatitudes for comfort and encouragement. But sometimes Jesus spoke words that followers then and now have found difficult. He instructs disciples to hate members of their own families (Luke 14:26), to act as if they were slaves (Matthew 20:27), and to sell their belongings and give to the poor (Luke 18:22). He restricts his mission (Matthew 10:6); he speaks of damnation (Matthew 8:12); he calls Jews the devil's children (John 8:44). This book shows how these difficult teachings would have sounded to the people who first heard them, how have they been understood over time, and how we might interpret them in the context of the Gospel of love and reconciliation.

OFFERING OF THE LETTERS WITH BREAD FOR THE WORLD

In October as we reflect on the words, life and call of the prophets we will be participating in Bread for the World's Offering of the Letters. Each person will be invited and guided to join in the work of our prophetic task of calling on those in power to care for the vulnerable in our world. In the Offering of Letters each person will be invited and instructed to write a personal letter to our members of congress advocating for just policies that address food insecurity.
